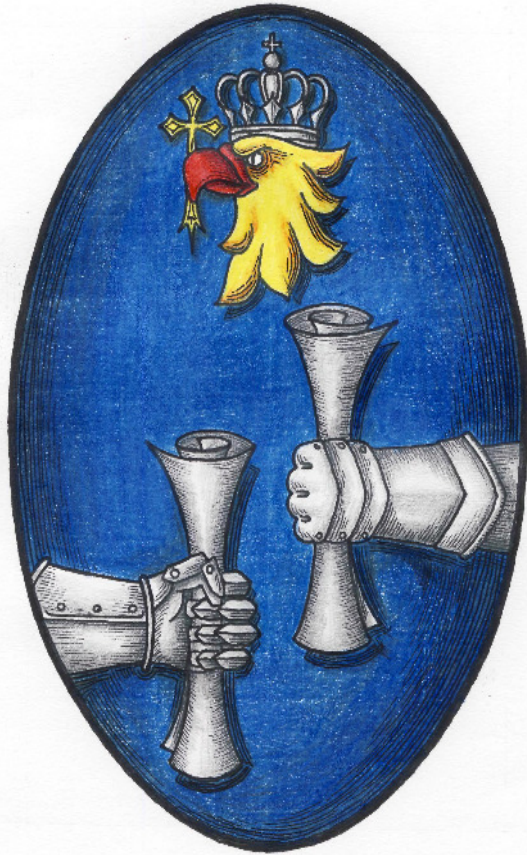


## Group of Research on the History of Law (Grupul de cercetare pentru studiul istoriei dreptului)



The GRHL (GCSID) brings together historians, legal scholars and philosophers affiliated to the “Nicolae Iorga” Institute of History (Bucharest), the “Andrei Rădulescu” Institute of Legal Research (Bucharest), the University of Bucharest, the “Babeş-Bolyai” University (Cluj-Napoca), the “Lucian Blaga” University (Sibiu) and the “Al. Ioan Cuza” University (Iaşi), all of them working on the interdisciplinary study of legal processes. It aims at the elaboration of new approaches on the relations between law and social sciences and the participation to national and European programs of research in the field. The center is conceived to establish long-term collaborations with organisms of the same sort functioning in Romania and abroad.

The areas of interests of the individual researchers are combined such as to allow the opening of multiple vistas towards the interconnected paths of legal development in various national spaces. A special focus is placed on the interpretation of the institutional departures sustained by the great turning-points of the process of legal change, themselves placed in relation with relevant theoretical innovations. The basic references of the philosophy of law are thus revisited in conjunction with the broad social and cultural implications of the doctrines involved.
