Call for papers

“Studii și Materiale de Istorie Modernă” is a journal of the “Nicolae Iorga” Institute of History, founded in 1957, devoted to research in modern history from the late eighteenth century to the early twentieth century. The journal publishes original interpretive articles, documentary contributions, reviews and reading notes, as well as presentations of scholarly events and debates.

From the very beginning, an important place in its contents has been held by major historical events and developments such as the **Oriental/Eastern Crisis**, the **1848 Revolution**, the **Era of the 1859 Union**, the **Romanian war of independence**, or the **First World War**, without neglecting topics in **economic and social history** and the **history of art**, such as those concerning the **transformations in industry and agriculture in the nineteenth century**, **agrarian crises, conventions and treaties, commercial relations, the navigation on the Danube, book trade, lease holding, the consequences of the Rural Law of 1864, the situation of children, or Romanian fine-arts education**. At the same time, the journal has published articles on the **relations of the Romanian principalities (and later Romania) with other nations**, and on the **image of Romanians** abroad. Another important chapter in the journal’s activity has been the **publication of documents, both internal sources and external**. In this respect, we mention the accounts of several **foreign travellers**. In recent decades, the journal’s horizon of interests has expanded, including analytical articles or those with a methodological focus on topics such as the **use of historical databases** or the internet as a documentation tool. Issues with a theoretical content have also begun to be addressed, falling under the umbrella of the **history of political ideas** and **cultural history**. In recent years, the journal has introduced the section “In Debate”, in which various specialists discuss topical issues, for example the relationship between politics and culture or the implications of online education.

If your research interests align with the themes mentioned above, or with similar or related ones, you are welcome to publish in our journal, **indexed in the EBSCO database** (<https://about.ebsco.com/m/ee/Marketing/titleLists/30h-coverage.htm>).

The journal is issued annually, toward the end of the year. Article or material proposals may be submitted at any time. However, for publication in the current year we recommend sending them between January and July.



Articles, presentations, and reviews are accepted in Romanian and in any internationally used language, accompanied by an abstract. Submissions in Romanian require an abstract in an internationally used language.

Contributions are not subject to a word limit, nor to limits on appendices or illustrations. We recommend only maintaining a balance among the different content elements.
